Airline Check-In Counter Relocation Underway at DEN

DENVER – Aug. 16, 2022 –Starting Aug. 17 and continuing through October 2022, Denver International Airport (DEN) will be relocating the airline check-in counters that are currently located at the far northwest and northeast ends of the Jeppesen Terminal. This is necessary to accommodate construction of the new security checkpoints.

The airlines will be moving to the south end of Level 6 on either the east or west sides. Passengers will need to pay close attention to the location of their airline check-in counter as it may move from the East Terminal to the West Terminal or vice versa. The first two airlines to relocate will be Delta and Spirit Airlines both of which will be moving from the East Terminal to the West Terminal this week.

Delta Airlines Move

Starting at **12:30 a.m. on Aug. 17**, Delta Airlines will move its check-in operations from pod 0 on the east side of Level 6 in the Jeppesen Terminal to pod 6 located on the west side of Level 6. Delta will begin serving passengers in its new location, inside Door 612, starting at **2:30 a.m. on Aug. 17**. Pod numbers are noted on the overhead yellow signs hanging from the ceiling in the ticket counter areas.

Spirit Airlines Move

Starting at **8:30 p.m. on Aug. 18**, Spirit Airlines will be moving its check-in location from pod 0 on the east side of Level 6 in the Jeppesen Terminal to pod 5 located on the west side of Level 6. Spirit will begin serving passengers in its new location, inside Door 616, starting at **2 a.m. on Aug. 19**.

Additional airline relocations including Allegiant, American Airlines, Boutique Air, Denver Air Connection, Frontier Airlines, JetBlue Airways, Sun Country Airlines, Southern Airways Express and all international carriers will take place through October. Passengers are encouraged to visit www.flydenver.com the day prior to their flight to confirm the location of their airline within the Terminal. Signage on Peña Boulevard and curbside signage will also be updated to direct passengers to the correct set of doors on all levels.

If you need assistance finding the location of your airline, please look for a DEN Ambassador in a purple vest, employees with badges, or construction personnel that can help you. You can also utilize the DEN interactive map that offers step-by-step directions to airlines and amenities within DEN. Check-in directories are also available to help identify your airline's pod number. DEN will have temporary signage installed at the old Delta and Spirit ticketing counters to assist passengers who may be unaware that the airlines have moved.

The airline relocations are temporary and will allow work to progress on Phase 2 and the Completion Phase of the Great Hall Project. These phases will build new security checkpoints on the northwest and northeast corners of Level 6 and eventually these airlines will be relocated into permanent spaces similar to those of United and Southwest.
