Denver International Airport Snow Update: March 15, 2:30 p.m.

DENVER — March 15, 2021 — Denver International Airport (DEN) has reopened four of six runways and flights are actively landing and departing. DEN is officially in storm recovery and will continue to clear snow from roadways and remote areas of the airfield. Delays and cancellations are possible tonight and tomorrow as airlines begin to recover their operations. Passengers are encouraged to continue to stay in touch with their airlines for scheduled flight information.

For travelers returning to DEN today or tomorrow, DEN offers free vehicle services to customers, including jump starts. For any vehicle services, call (303) 342-4645, 24 hours a day, seven days a week.
