## **Denver International Airport Begins Annual Peña Boulevard Maintenance**

**DENVER** – Oct. 1, 2021 – Denver International Airport (DEN) will begin its annual Peña Boulevard concrete panel replacement project on Sunday, Oct. 3 at 11 p.m. This work will repair and replace aging and deteriorating concrete on outbound Peña Boulevard from the terminal to approximately E-470. This work will occur Sunday through Thursday from 11 p.m. to 7 a.m. and will consist of various single or double lane closures. At least one lane will remain open at all times.

“This annual project is part of our Vision 100 plan that is focused not only on enhancing our current infrastructure but maintaining what we currently have,” said DEN CEO Phil Washington. “This critical project allows us to replace portions of the roadway that have deteriorated to help extend the life of Peña Boulevard and ensure we provide a safe roadway for our employees and passengers today and in the future.”

The Peña Boulevard panel replacement repairs are a separate project from the ongoing work on inbound Peña Boulevard between Jackson Gap and the Terminal. Some work will overlap with the existing inbound work, but project teams are coordinating to minimize impacts. The outbound Peña Boulevard panel replacement project will be complete by the end of October, weather permitting.
