

70 TRAFFIC AND PUBLIC SAFETY

70.01 Incorporation of City Traffic Code: Applicability of Rules

In addition to the Rules and Regulations in this part 70 and to other applicable Airport Rules and Regulations, the Manager of Public Works hereby adopts and incorporates the Denver Revised Municipal Code, Chapter 54, TRAFFIC REGULATIONS, except Section 54-2(5), (also referred to as the "City Traffic Code") as Rules and Regulations pertaining to traffic at the Airport, including pedestrians, bicycles, and motor vehicles. In the event there exists any conflict between any provision contained in the City Traffic Code and any provision set forth specifically in these Rules and Regulations, such that the two cannot be reconciled, the latter shall control. These Rules and Regulations shall apply to all areas of the Airport including, but not limited to, roadways, parking lots, undeveloped property, sidewalks, and driveways, in all secured and unsecured areas.

70.02 Law Enforcement: Other Sanctions

Enforcement of the City Traffic Code as well as these Airport Rules and Regulations, will be carried out by the Denver Police Department, and by federal, state and county authorities either by virtue of their respective jurisdiction over Airport property, or pursuant to written intergovernmental agreements among or between such authorities and/or the City. In addition to any civil or criminal judicial enforcement action which may be pursued for a violation, or alleged violation, of any Airport rule, administrative sanctions (for example, loss of a permit or privilege) may be imposed as provided for in the Airport Rules and Regulations or otherwise by law.

70.03 Ready and Safe Operation of Motor Vehicles

No person who is physically or mentally disabled or incapacitated in any particular manner either temporarily or permanently, shall drive a motor vehicle on the Airport, provided such disability or incapacity is such as to interfere with the ready and safe operation of such vehicle.

70.04 Drivers to be Licensed

No person shall drive a motor vehicle upon the Airport, unless such person shall have and be in possession of a current valid operator's or chauffeur's license issued to him by the State of Colorado, if required to be so licensed by this State, or some other state, if not required to be so licensed by the State of Colorado. No person shall drive a commercial motor vehicle upon the Airport unless such person shall have and be in possession of a valid commercial driver's license for the type of vehicle operated. Upon request, drivers shall exhibit their license to any police officer or other, official authorized to issue citations.

70.05 Obligations of Persons Owning, Possessing or Controlling Vehicles

No person who owns, has control, possession, or charge of any vehicle shall permit the following persons to drive, have charge of, operate, or control said vehicle or vehicles on the Airport:

- .05-1 Any person whose operator's or chauffeur's license has been denied, canceled, suspended, or revoked by any governmental agency or lawful authority.
- .05-2 Any person who has never obtained a current valid operator's or chauffeur's license, or who has an expired license.
- .05-3 Any person who has a fictitious or fraudulently altered operator's or chauffeur's license.
- .05-4 Any person who is under the influence of intoxicating beverages, narcotics, or drugs.
- .05-5 Any person who has not yet reached the sixteenth anniversary of his or her birth.
- .05-6 Any person who is either physically or mentally disabled or injured or incapacitated, either temporarily or permanently, and such incapacity interferes with such person's ability to operate a motor vehicle in a ready and safe manner.

70.06 Reporting of Accidents by Vehicle Operators

The operator of any vehicle, other than aircraft, involved in an accident on the Airport resulting in injury to or the death of any person, or property damage, shall stop such vehicle at the scene of such accident, or as near thereto as conditions permit within 300 feet of the point of impact between the vehicle and the object or person first struck, and after determining that the Office of the Director of Aviation or a police officer on the Airport has been notified by the quickest means of communication of the location of the accident, shall forthwith and without delay return to and remain at the scene of the accident until officers of the Denver Police Department have arrived at the scene of such accident, a written report of the circumstances of the accident has been taken by such officers and they have given their permission for the parties involved in the accident to leave the scene.

The driver of a vehicle involved in any accident shall, whether requested to or not, give his name, address, registration number of the vehicle he is driving, exhibit his operator's or chauffeur's license to any other person involved in the accident, or to any person who is the owner of or in charge of any property damaged in the accident and, unless such accident has been reported to the Office of the Director

of Aviation or to a police officer on the Airport, and a written report of the circumstances thereof has been taken by a police officer or officers as set forth in this section set forth, given a written report of such accident to the Denver Police Department within twenty-four hours after the occurrence thereof, such report to be upon a form to be prepared and made available by the police department and to contain all of the information required or called for by such form to the extent that the same is known by the driver making the report.

Whenever possible and unless directed otherwise by a police officer, no vehicle or vehicles involved in an accident shall be moved from the relative position of the vehicle or vehicles reached immediately after the impact between the vehicles or person or object struck.

70.07 Reporting of Accidents by Vehicle Owners (Later-discovered Incident)

The owner of any vehicle which has been involved in an accident on the Airport shall make a report thereof to the Director of Aviation and to the police department of the City and County of Denver, if subsequent to the time of the accident he learns that the vehicle is damaged or that an accident has occurred and a report thereof was not made to the police department by the driver or person in control of the vehicle as hereinabove required. The report required to be given by the provisions of this section shall be made immediately and without delay after an owner of a vehicle receives such information.
